Good Morning!

Here's the 13<sup>th</sup> in a series of letters I'm writing to the founder of Quakerism, George Fox.

Dear George,

Last night I attended a worship service featuring a song with these lyrics, "Set a fire down in my soul that I can't contain, that I can't control." I couldn't help but think of you and early Friends as I sang this chorus. Honestly, it scared me a bit. I've experienced some moments and seasons where the Spirit of God moved powerfully, and in every single instance I had this feeling of being out-of-control. I'm sure you know what I mean.

I'll never forget hearing John & Carol Wimber speak at a conference in Richmond nearly 25 years ago. Prior to leading the Vineyard Church movement they were at a Friends Church in California where faithful believers regularly prayed for revival. They reported when "revival" came in forms that were uncomfortable, however, it wasn't well received. It's made me question if I'm willing to receive a fresh movement of God's Spirit if it is packaged in a way that feels uncomfortable to me.

We tend to speak sentimentally of you and early Friends, longing for the Spirit

of God to move among us today as it did during your lifetime. But truthfully, such a movement might rapidly exceed our "weirdness threshold." I fully expect the outpouring of God's Spirit on IYM to continue and deepen in intensity. Thank you for providing an example that valued experiencing the Living Christ above being comfortable, and valued obedience above image maintenance. I'm glad God set a fire in your soul that couldn't be contained or controlled.


